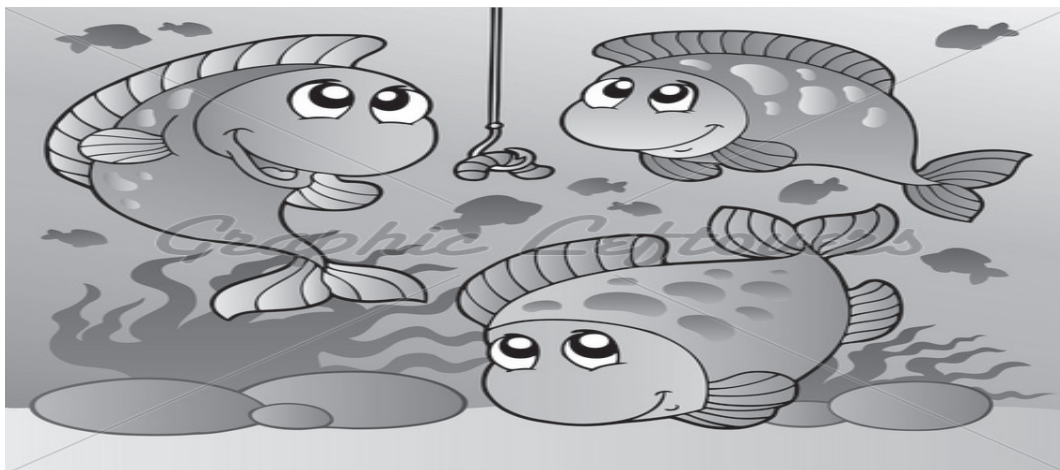

“There are plenty of fish in this lake. We’ll come and catch them tomorrow,” they said.

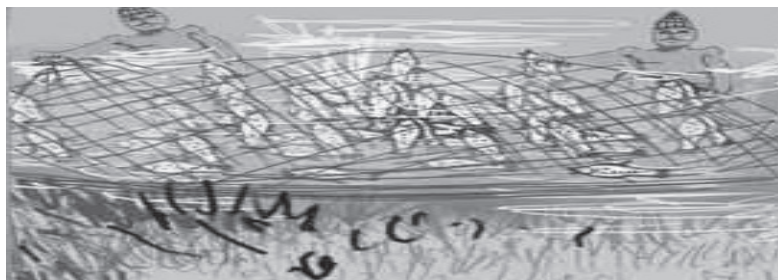
‘This place is not safe any longer,’ the fish thought. He quickly swam to his friends to tell them.
